A Transforming Presence in Every Zip Code? How About Every County First?

I like the challenge that has been placed before us to have a transforming presence in every zip code. As Shenandoah Wesleyans we should desire that! Do you realize that we have a combined total of 2,065 zip codes in Virginia and West Virginia? As I have thought about this I've been reminded that we currently don't have a Wesleyan presence in every Virginia and West Virginia county. There are 150 counties within our two great states! Perhaps the best way for us to go after every zip code is to first go after every county. We have a TON of work to do!

How do we get a huge job like that accomplished? As district leader I ask that question. The following are a few of my thoughts. Feel free to chime in.....

1. One County at a Time – The old saying is “Rome wasn’t built overnight”. We will not be in every county by next summer. We can however be in a “new” county in 2018!!
2. Having a Heart for Multiplication – In order to grow a local church we have to add. Adding is something we should do, something we need to do. We have local churches that are GROWING! As we envision having a transforming presence in every county and zip code, we will have to have a heart for multiplication. Local churches will need to multiply themselves, not simply add. Jesus tells us to “Go” and make disciples.
3. Raising Up Church Planters – For Shenandoah to be in every county in VA and WV we will need to raise up our own pioneers/planters. We will never be able to recruit enough harvest workers from other places.

If we are going to fulfill the goal before us, our local churches will have to preach multiplication, talk multiplication, pray multiplication, model multiplication and challenge men and women to respond to multiplication. The reason? Reaching the lost for Jesus Christ!!!

Peter Wagner says, “The single most effective evangelistic methodology under heaven is planting new churches.” How many Wesleyan churches are in your county? Are there any Wesleyan churches in the county that borders the county you live in? We have to start somewhere, why not in every county!! Are you up for the challenge?

The United States Wesleyan Hispanic Church funds first Global Partners Missionary

The first Hispanic Global Partners missionary has been appointed and sent to serve among Muslim immigrants in Europe. In 2016, Liz* was appointed by Global Partners to serve among Muslim immigrants in Europe. Partnering mostly with Hispanic churches, she traveled the country visiting churches in more than 12 states while preparing for her ministry.

According to Liz, the response from those churches was unbelievable! Most of her supporting churches had never been involved in missions; others wanted to help, but did not know how. Even though some churches did not have the economic or budget possibilities to commit to a faith promise, they came together and created a plan to make funding possible. Through their prayers and generosity in giving, the United States Wesleyan Hispanic Church is becoming more and more involved in helping send missionaries—even to the hard places.

“We live in an exciting era of God’s mission,” said Ben Ward, director of communication and innovations architect for Global Partners. “Today, people from many language groups are not only receiving missionaries, but sending them as well. In order to fulfill the Great Commission, this global collaboration is essential.”

On behalf of our brothers and sisters of the Wesleyan Church in El Salvador, greetings! As we all enter this joyful time of year, there is much to be thankful for. Here are some highlights of what God is doing in El Salvador.

Our own Jonny Blatt of ReClaim Church in Huntington, WV leaves December 1 to serve for one year as a missionary in El Salvador. While he is there he will focus his efforts on the church youth, working to help prepare them as missionaries who will go out into their communities and beyond to share the Message of Christ. Please be in prayer for their annual National Youth Camp, coming up December 15-16.

El Salvador joins other countries of Latin America who are looking to their newest mission field: the Muslim world. Pastors and lay leaders are beginning the process of training to effectively reach followers of Islam in other countries for Christ. They are passionate about this new door that is opening, and they need prayer for God's guidance, provision, and protection.

In the way of short term missions from our district, Parkway Staunton is planning a trip to El Salvador in December led by Kelly Schuhmann, our District Missions Board director. Watch for highlights from their ministry on our DMB website or Facebook.

If you or your church would be interested in a short term mission to El Salvador, please get in touch with me! National Superintendent René Meléndez has said many times that having a team come in is one of the most effective ways for them to amplify their ministry. CLERGY CARE UPDATE

Dear Colleagues:

Early this year, Pastor Greg asked me if I would take on the role of Clergy Care Director for the Shenandoah District. After much thought and prayer I agreed.

Our denomination is working hard to develop a structured clergy care program designed to get in front of the many day-to-day factors contributing to pastors' physical, mental, emotional, and spiritual well-being. This year, the District made significant investments in clergy care, including frequent interface with headquarters. We've shared lessons learned, contributed to conference calls, and attended formal training sessions. We've also analyzed and discussed the recent Notre Dame study highlighting the key drivers negatively impacting pastors and their families today.

In May of this year, I attended the first clergy care workshop in Louisville. It included nearly 20 clergy care directors from across the country. We discussed what each District is doing and how headquarters is committed to pastor well-being.

In September, we held the first Clergy Care Retreat (CCR), with the theme: "Rest for the Run of Your Life". Over 50 pastors and spouses were challenged with God's mandate to observe the 4th Commandment (Exodus 20:8-11, [20:20](#), 20:23-24 and Mark 2:27). We sharpened one another, discussed the obstacles in becoming faithful to God's direction, worked personal Sabbath development plans, and then assigned accountability partners. While this continues as work in progress, I'm hearing some good reports. In fact, the Shenandoah District is the only District to date who has initiated a CCR and headquarters is using this model for the rest of the denomination. A special thank you for those who invested in this retreat and for fostering discussions and sharing ideas.

Like many of you, I am wired to help others, even it means sacrificing my own personal development time, time with my family, and time with the Lord. For me, I must be intentional not to get so tied up in ministry, that I forget that I can't be much good to anyone else, unless or until I look out after my own well-being and the family God has charged me to lead biblically.

As I shared at this year's CCR, Pastor Greg and I agreed that sometimes, pastors need pastors who are not in the District "chain-of-command". We discussed the 1-800 number the denomination has for pastors, but also discussed the need for someone to share with someone local and a bit more personal. As the District Clergy Care Director, I am here as a confidential sounding board for

anyone in the District. I bring a wide-range of expertise from both my secular consulting background and pastoral ministry and will always make myself available to anyone in the District. In fact, we are also looking at developing and implementing a Clergy Care Team designed to provide pastoral intervention when and where needed across the District. Several pastors have already expressed a desire and willingness to be part of that team.

Several in the District have already reached out and I am encouraged at how the Lord is renewing their spirit. While the District's mission is: "...to develop healthy pastors and healthy reproducing churches to impact the world with the life-changing Gospel of Jesus Christ", it can only happen with transparency and a willingness to recognize none of us are in this battle called ministry alone. It takes a submissive spirit to seek help and guidance, and then trust the Lord will honor that decision.

I pray you each have a joyful Christmas season and a very spiritually prosperous new year. I'm praying for you and your families, and your ministries by name.

LOCAL CHURCH NEWS

Christ Community Church, Williamsburg, VA



Christ Community Church was established as the result of a personal calling for **Rev. Randy Garner** and his wife Cindy. They wanted a church name and a motto that reflected their desire to place Christ first in their ministry. Twenty years later the motto, "A Place Where Christ's Love is Real and People Really Care," has not changed. In fact, it has become a "calling card" for the church in the local community.

Their twentieth anniversary service presented an opportunity for a time of reflection and renewal of the biblical principles that





Roanoke, VA

Preston Park Elementary School is about a half mile from Emmanuel Wesleyan Church. Every student in the school qualifies for free or reduced school breakfasts and lunches. For many of these children, school breakfasts and lunches are the only nutritious meals they receive. Several years ago EWC was asked by Congregations In Action if we would participate in a pack-a-snack program for Preston Park Elementary. The church readily agreed to pack 25 snacks each week to send home with the most needy children on Friday's to ensure that they would have something to eat during the weekend. Over the years other churches that were part of the pack-a-snack program were no longer able to participate, the school principal, Eric Fisher, would call and ask if we could pack a few more snacks. Every time he asked, we said yes! Today, EWC packs 125 snack packs for children each week during the school year.



Our consistency and willingness to serve the "least of these" made an impression on Mr. Fisher, who two years ago began attending EWC, accepted Christ and recently completed a discipleship course. In addition, the secretary at Preston Park and her family began attending EWC and have become members.

Our involvement in the pack-a-snack program led us to launch a school supply drive that has grown into an annual event. The congregation of EWC generously buys enough pencils, glue sticks, notebooks, crayons, and scissors to ensure that 300 students have the supplies they need to start school. The School Supply Drive has become a Back to School party with games, bounce houses, free hamburgers and hotdogs and 40 lucky children receive new bookbags. Each year we try and find ways to improve the Back to School party and look for creative ways to share the gospel and introduce the students and their parents to the ministry of EWC.

This past fall I had the privilege of being invited to a teachers luncheon and was asked to pray for the teachers and staff at Preston Park as they began the new school year. We are slowly building trust with the students and families as we serve them in practical ways with no strings attached, and are now seeing some families from Preston Park Elementary begin to attend our church. We ask that you would pray that God would increase our influence for Him in our community and that these families would come to know Jesus personally.
