Honesty	Romans 3:23 For all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God.	“The Truth About All of Us” Text: Romans 3:9–26 Focus: Universal sin, no one righteous, God’s provision of righteousness in Christ. “No One Is Righteous” Text: Romans 3:10–12 Focus: Shattering self-righteousness; leveling the ground at the foot of the cross. “The Deceitful Heart” Text: Jeremiah 17:9–10 Focus: Honesty about our inner condition; God who searches the heart. “If We Say We Have No Sin” Text: 1 John 1:8–10 Focus: Confession vs. denial; God’s faithfulness to forgive and cleanse. “Surely I Was Sinful from Birth” Text: Psalm 51:1–5 Focus: David’s honest confession; owning sin instead of excusing it. “Woe Is Me: When God’s Holiness Exposes Our Sin” Text: Isaiah 6:1–7 Focus: Encountering God’s glory, recognizing uncleanness, receiving cleansing. “I Am Ruined Without You” Text: Isaiah 64:6–8 Focus: Our righteousness as filthy rags; God as potter, we as clay. “We All Like Sheep Have Gone Astray” Text: Isaiah 53:4–6 Focus: Our wandering, His substitution; the honest admission “each has turned to his own way.” “The Man in the Mirror” Text: James 1:22–25 Focus: God’s Word as a mirror; not walking away from what it reveals. “Broken and Contrite: The Sacrifice God Will Not Despise” Text: Psalm 51:16–17 Focus: God’s nearness to the broken; honesty as worship, not weakness. “Dead in Sin, Alive Only in Christ” Text: Ephesians 2:1–5 Focus: Powerlessness (“dead”), God’s mercy and grace making us alive.

			“The Wages of Sin and the Gift of God” Text: Romans 6:20–23 Focus: Where sin leads vs. what God freely gives in Christ. “Godly Sorrow vs. Worldly Regret” Text: 2 Corinthians 7:8–11 Focus: Honest grief over sin that leads to repentance and life. “Have Mercy on Me, a Sinner” Text: Luke 18:9–14 (Pharisee and tax collector) Focus: Honest humility vs. religious pride; the one who goes home justified. “Without Me You Can Do Nothing” Text: John 15:1–5 Focus: Powerlessness apart from Christ; dependence as the only way to fruitfulness.

Hope	Ephesians 2:8 For it is by grace you have been saved, through faith—and this is not from yourselves, it is the gift of God—	“Grace That Raises the Dead” Text: Ephesians 2:1–10 Focus: We were dead, but God made us alive; transformation is His work. “A New Creation, Not a Better Version” Text: 2 Corinthians 5:17 Focus: Grace doesn’t improve us—it recreates us. “He Who Began a Good Work” Text: Philippians 1:6 Focus: Hope rooted in God’s commitment to finish what He starts. “The God Who Makes All Things New” Text: Revelation 21:5 Focus: God’s nature is renewal; transformation is His signature. “My Grace Is Sufficient for You” Text: 2 Corinthians 12:7–10 Focus: God’s power made perfect in weakness; hope for the struggling. “The Potter and the Clay” Text: Jeremiah 18:1–6 Focus: God reshaping broken lives; grace as a hands-on process. “He Restores My Soul” Text: Psalm 23:1–3 Focus: God as Shepherd who leads, restores, and renews. “The God Who Lifts Us Up” Text: Psalm 40:1–3 Focus: From the pit to a firm place; transformation that becomes a testimony. “Come to Me... and I Will Give You Rest” Text: Matthew 11:28–30 Focus: Grace as relief, rest, and a new way of living.

			“The Light Shines in the Darkness” Text: John 1:1–5 Focus: Darkness cannot overcome the transforming power of Christ. “Born Again: A New Start Only God Can Give” Text: John 3:1–8 Focus: Transformation is spiritual rebirth, not self-effort. “The God Who Heals the Brokenhearted” Text: Psalm 147:3 Focus: Grace meets us in our wounds and brings restoration. “The Spirit of the Lord Brings Freedom” Text: 2 Corinthians 3:17–18 Focus: Transformation from glory to glory by the Spirit. “He Gives Beauty for Ashes” Text: Isaiah 61:1–4 Focus: The Messiah’s mission: healing, freedom, rebuilding ruined places. “Hope That Does Not Disappoint” Text: Romans 5:1–5 Focus: Grace produces endurance, character, and a hope anchored in God’s love.

			“In All Your Ways Acknowledge Him” Text: Psalm 37:3–7 Focus: Trust, commit, delight, and wait—four movements of surrender. “Unless the Lord Builds the House” Text: Psalm 127:1–2 Focus: The futility of self-effort; the peace of God-led living. “Here Am I, Send Me” Text: Isaiah 6:1–8 Focus: Surrender as response to God’s holiness and grace. “Abide in Me” Text: John 15:1–8 Focus: Fruitfulness through dependence; surrender as staying connected. “Commit Your Way to the Lord” Text: Psalm 37:5 Focus: Rolling our burdens and decisions onto God. “The Steps of a Good Person Are Ordered by the Lord” Text: Psalm 37:23–24 Focus: God’s guidance even when we stumble. “Walk by Faith, Not by Sight” Text: 2 Corinthians 5:6–9 Focus: Trusting God beyond what we can see or control. “Be Still and Know That I Am God” Text: Psalm 46:10 Focus: Surrender through stillness; letting God be God.
